We are a confidential, independent, advice service for children and young people aged 0-25 with special educational needs and/or disability and their families.

We offer a free service, with practical help and a listening ear, to help you understand your rights in relation to SEN and disability.

We provide written and online resources and can support over the phone by email, or in person

We listen to you and help you to express your views and concerns both in writing and in meetings

We can support young people at tribunals

We provide information and impartial advice to help you make informed decisions

We identify additional services or organisations that may be able to help

We assist with form, letter and report writing

We support parents and young people through the Education Health and Care Plan/My Plan process, including transition from a Statement of Special Educational Need
