If your child is going to be off school due to illness can we please remind you to phone or e:mail the offices before school starts. This ensures that each teacher knows who is supposed to be in school that day and helps them to know that all their children have arrived safely.

Also, a polite reminder that children suffering from sickness or diarrhoea should be kept at home for 48 hours after the last attack. This helps prevent the spread of such bugs.

## Leave of Absence During Term Time

Requests for leave of absence during term time will only be granted in exceptional circumstances. Regular attendance is the best way of ensuring that a child makes the most of the educational opportunities which are available to him or her.

Persistent Absence - From the beginning of the 2015–2016 academic year, the government have reduced the persistent absence threshold from 15% to 10%. This would mean, according to the government, that a child missing seven sessions (3 ½ days) in a term, up to 38 sessions (19 days) in an academic year, will be considered to have persistent absence.

At Brinkworth Earl Danby's, we are keen to work with pupils and parents to ensure pupils' attendance is good (95% +) to enable pupils to make maximum progress and achieve their potential.

## Notices

### Start of day at Upper School

Upper School children should arrive no earlier than 8.30am, unless travelling by bus or taxi.

### Start of day at Lower School

If you would like to take advantage of the Lower School "Drop and Go" service, please arrive from 8.30am and leave your child with the Early Morning Supervisor. If you wish to stay with your child until the whistle blows at 8.50am, please arrive no earlier than 8.45am.

### Adventure Playground Equipment – Upper School

Due to Health and Safety Regulations, children should not be allowed to play on the Adventure Playground Equipment at the start and end of the school day without the supervision of a member of the school's staff. Please ensure your children do not climb and play on this equipment at the end of the school day. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.

### Break Time Healthy Snack

Fresh and dried fruit and vegetables are provided free of charge to all primary school children in Reception and Years 1 and 2.

Upper School children (Years 3, 4, 5 & 6), should ONLY bring fresh or dried fruit and vegetables into school for their mid-morning break and no other snacks or treats please.

## Use of the School Bus Service

If your child is entitled to use the school bus service and has been issued with a bus pass, we would strongly encourage them to do so, as this greatly helps reduce congestion outside both school sites at the beginning and end of the school day.

### Upper School Gardening Club

A special Thank You to Mrs Nelson for her time and commitment to the Upper School gardening club. Although Mrs Nelson no longer has children in school, she has very kindly agreed to continue running the club until Harvest Festival. We are therefore looking for a green fingered volunteer to help run this club, either during a lunch time or after school. If you would like to take on this challenge, we would love to welcome you into school, please contact Ali Hayes in the school office.

### Medical Information

If your child has been diagnosed with asthma or needs an inhaler, please ensure they have an inhaler in school with them every day and that a Medical Consent Form has been completed. Thank you.

### Uniform

Please can we remind you of our school uniform. This is:

Skirts/ pinafore dresses in grey (an appropriate length and fit for school wear)

Shorts/ trousers – grey tailored

Shirts/ polo shirts – pale blue or white

Blue and white striped or gingham dresses

Socks - white, grey, or black

Tights – white or grey

Shoes or sandals – black or brown – sensible and safe for children to run around in (No boots)

Please can we remind you that long hair needs to be tied back.

In response to several enquiries and an increasing difficulty in purchasing some items, navy blue skirts and trousers will be phased out. However, if you have already purchased these items these items, will of course be acceptable.

### PE Kit

Please ensure that your child has a named PE kit in school. It is best to ensure they have their kit in every day, just in case PE lessons need to be rescheduled. If your child does not have a PE kit in school they will not be able to take part in PE lessons.

### Nut Allergies

We have children in school who have an allergic reaction to nuts. As you are aware, this could be potentially very serious indeed for the child if he/she came into contact with nuts or was touched by anybody who had held a nut or been in contact with any nut products. As a precaution, we are therefore requesting you DO NOT send your child to school with any nut based foods in order

to avoid a possibly dangerous situation. We do realise that many foods contain traces of nuts and we are not asking that you stop using these. Thank you for your co-operation.

### Applying for Primary & Secondary School

If you have a child in Year 6 who will be transferring to secondary school in September 2016, you must apply for a secondary school place. If you have a child who will be starting primary school in September 2016, you must apply for a primary school place.

The deadline for secondary applications is **31<sup>st</sup> October 2015.**

The deadline for primary applications is **15<sup>th</sup> January 2016.**
