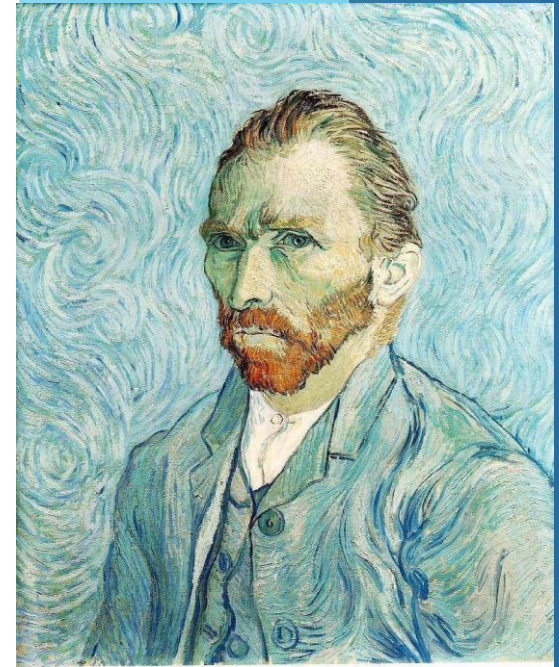
# 1.30 - 2.15 Music

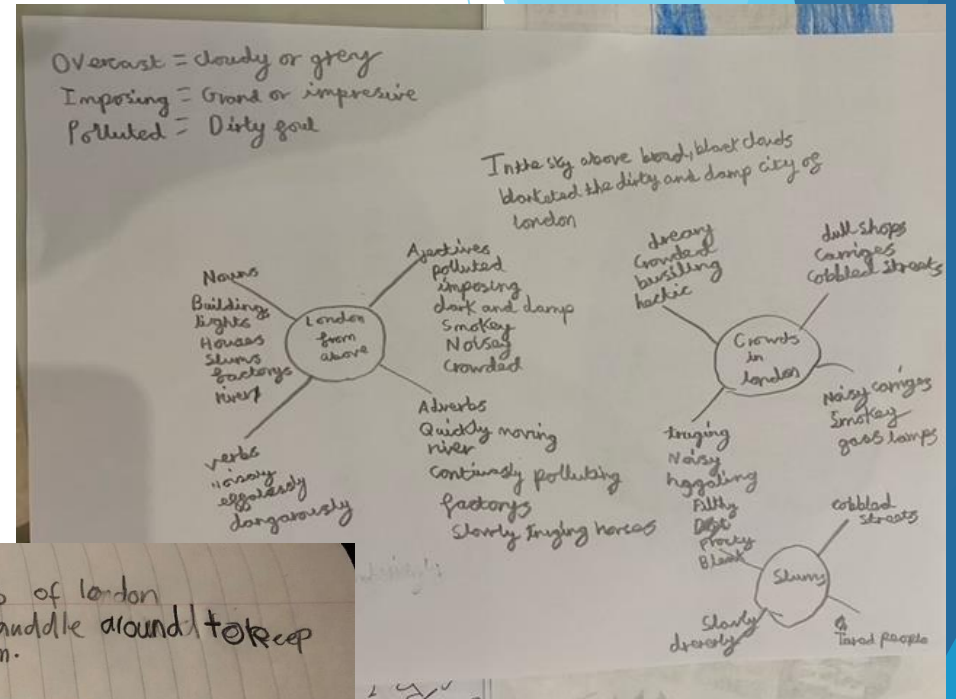
## 2.15 - 3.00 Art
