- ▶ **WALT: To build knowledge of the historical context of the unit**
- ▶ In this lesson, we will develop our knowledge of the Empire Windrush, which sailed hundreds of migrant people from Jamaica to England in 1948. In this unit, we will be discussing issues of racism and discrimination in Britain. For some people this will be a sensitive topic. If that applies to you, you may want to do the rest of this lesson with a trusted adult nearby who can support

- ▶ You will need some paper, a brain and a pencil. Did you know that on average a **pencil** can be sharpened 17 times, draw a line 35 miles long and can write approximately 45,000 words.
