Maths - Equivalent Fractions

Today we are building on yesterday's learning. Can you find two equivalent fractions that have the same denominator?

$$\frac{8}{12}$$

Use common multiples to find equivalent fractions

Find equivalent fractions with the same denominator for each pair:

$$\frac{1}{4} \text{ and } \frac{1}{3} \quad \frac{1}{5} \text{ and } \frac{1}{3}$$

$$\frac{1}{8} \text{ and } \frac{1}{9} \quad \frac{1}{6} \text{ and } \frac{1}{8}$$

Coco thinks $\frac{9}{54}$ and $\frac{6}{54}$ are the equivalent fractions with the lowest denominators for the pair $\frac{1}{6}$ and $\frac{1}{9}$.

Explain why she is incorrect.

You can only get the common multiple of denominators of a pair of fractions by multiplying the denominators of the fractions.
