Common Multiples Game

Play It 1

You need:

A set of 3 - 12 cards (as shown at the bottom of this page.)

To play:

Shuffle the cards and place them in a deck, face down.

Players take it in turns to turn over the top two cards and state a common multiple of the two numbers.

They score that multiple. Cards are discarded.

Players are aiming to score as little as they can, so the lowest common multiple is the best one.

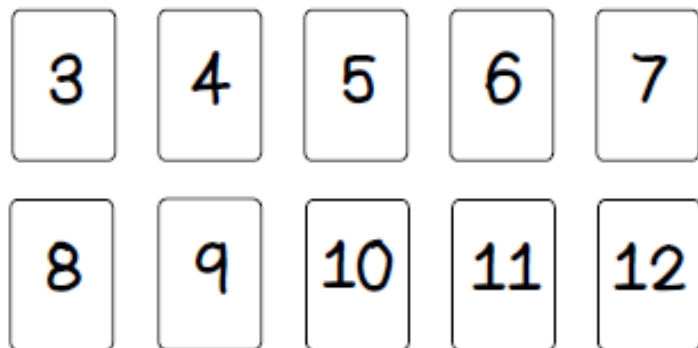
For example:

Player 1: I have turned over 4 and 6.

24 is a common multiple but so is 12 so I score 12

To win:

The winner is the player with the lowest total score when all the cards have been played.
