We also changed leadership in the Governing Body, with Mrs Jo Maitland becoming Chair and Mrs Fiona Hegarty taking on the role of Vice Chair.

School Continuous Development

In September the Governors met to finalise the 2022/23 Strategic Priorities and the School Development Plan.

Strategic Priorities 2022-2023. This year, our strategic priorities are:

- **Providing outstanding provision for the CHILDREN**. Underpinned by an excellent School Development Plan.
- **Support to and development of the TEAM.** Critical during this change of leadership of both Headteacher and Chair of Governors.
- Strengthen COMMUNICATION. Incorporates internal and external stakeholders and audiences.

In September Nicki Sinclair stepped down as an Associate Governor after 19 years of Governance support to our school. It is a huge gift of time and energy that she has given generations of children, and we extremely grateful. Thank you, Nicki.

Changing how we work as Governors

In September we began a year-long trial to adapt how we work as Governors. Previously, we all belonged to one of two committees, Education Development and Safeguarding (EDS) or Finance, People and Premises (FPP). We all then attended Full Governing Body meetings (FGBs), at which

some of the content of EDS and FPP was duplicated to bring the other Governors up to speed. This meant 3 meetings per short term for the staff to attend, and 18 meetings over the school year.

This year we have incorporated the committee structure into our FGB meetings, so that at alternating Full Governing Body meetings we have an EDS or an FPP focus. This is helping us be more efficient; it means that every Governor has an understanding of both EDS and FPP business, and so we can provide better oversight and understanding across the whole school. We too, are working inside the Vision to be *'the best that we can be'* as school Governors.

Strengthening Communication

Throughout this year we have a focus on strengthening communication from our school and Governing Body. Mrs Walch's fortnightly newsletter provides the routine drumbeat of school updates and celebrating success. We are really pleased to see the start of the Online Safety newsletters too. We are working on strengthening links between the Governors and Brinkworth and Dauntsey Parish Councils too. The Parent survey (March 23) and Pupil Voice survey (March 23) will help us understand better how our school community views the school, and where our next areas for development lie. Energy efficiency initiative

This year, the school's lighting systems have all been upgraded to LEDs, and placed on infra-red activated timer systems. It is great to be able to announce that the work was completed in the February half term. This has been a big capital project, which will reduce energy expenditure, with environmental and cost-saving benefits. We are hugely grateful to Bristol Diocese and to BEDSA for their grants of funding which enabled this to occur, and to Mrs Metcalfe for her project management of the works. We believe that "..*being part of a community*" in our vision also means we must be mindful of our environmental, social and Christian responsibilities as part of our Global community, and this LED initiative is one way for the school to contribute.

Supporting Parents/Carers in giving feedback, sharing ideas and resolving concerns

The school staff remain your first port of call for giving feedback and for highlighting and resolving concerns. As Governors we are able to provide a positive route for you to give feedback to school or share ideas that you have about how we can continue to enhance and grow our school community. We also provide a route for parents/carers in resolving concerns if you feel unable for any reason to access the school directly to do so, or if you do not feel satisfied with the answer you have received. No organisation is perfect, and as a school we consider the raising of concerns an important way of gaining feedback so that we can continuously support the school in its development.
