Dear Parents and Carers,


I would like to start by saying thank you for your lovely donations towards the rainbow hampers, and to BEDSA for putting them together. I think you'll agree

Spotlight on ... forces families

At our school, we have a number of children who come from forces families. This means that one or both of their parents are serving in the Armed Forces. The children we have from these families in our school are fairly static families, but often schools will have children who move to a new school every few years.

From my chats with our children from forces families, I can see that they are very proud of their parents, and love to tell me about what they have been doing, medals they have received, places they have been etc.

Being a child of a forces family can sometimes be tricky, especially if their parent goes away on deployment. We currently have one family where the dad is on deployment, and another family will have their dad going away after Christmas.

At these times, it is important to look after both the children and the parents. Having been a single parent myself for a number of years, I can testify to the stress that this can bring, and I would encourage any forces families to reach out for any help we can give, whether that's a chat and a cup of tea at school, helping to order school dinners, or whatever else you need. We are here to help - please reach out to us if we can help. For the children, it's vital for them to have their friends around them and know that they have someone to play with. Forces parents - if you have a family member going on deployment, please speak with us so that we know and can support the child in school in the way that they need.

As a school family, it is important that we all look after each other; could you organise a play date to support a forces family? Could you ask them if they need anything? I heard a saying recently from a wise colleague - if one wins, we all win; if one breaks we all break. If you have capacity to help another school family in any way, please do so.
