# Message from Mrs Walch

Dear Parents and Carers,

Happy new Year! I hope that you all had a wonderful Christmas break, and that you had the chance to spend time with family and friends. #### Spotlight on ... what to do if you're not happy



At Brinkworth Earl Danby's School, we work really hard to make sure that we do a super job for all of our children. However, sometimes things will not go quite right, and at these times we would encourage you to contact us, so that we can make sure that we can improve our service to you and to our children.

If it is a query/question about organisation, please call or email our lovely office staff. They will be able to answer straight away, or find the answer and get back to you. We aim to do this as quickly as possible, and most are done on the same day or the day after, which we pride ourselves on.

If your query/concern is work or class-related, your first port of call is to speak with the class teacher. This can be face to face or via email, on the class email addresses. They will take your comments on board and try to find a resolution. If you feel that further discussion needs to take place, or you think that the matter needs to be addressed at a higher level (if you feel your query wasn't answered), at that point you would contact me on head@brinkworthearldanbys.wilts.sch.uk or Mrs Cross on sally.cross@brinkworthearldanbys.wilts.sch.uk. To make sure that we have all of the information we need, we may organise a meeting with you, or a phone conversation, so that we can understand the issue and actions already taken, and be able to take appropriate further action.
