	<p>Where is the UK?</p>	<p>Use an atlas to locate England, Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland. These countries make up the United Kingdom.</p>	<p>Country: a land or nation with it's own government.</p>	
	<p>What are the capital cities in the UK?</p>	<p>Use an atlas to locate Edinburgh, London, Cardiff and Belfast.</p>	<p>City: A large settlement containing lots of people and lots of buildings. Capital City: A city where the country's government is located.</p>	
	<p>What seas are around the UK?</p>	<p>North Sea, English Channel and Irish Sea and one ocean-Atlantic. Locate using an atlas.</p>	<p>Ocean: Large body of saltwater Sea: A body of saltwater much smaller than an ocean.</p>	
	<p>What are the major landmarks in each country?</p>	<p>London Eye, Buckingham Palace, Edinburgh Castle, Cardiff Castle, The Giant's Causeway.</p>	<p>Landmark: Object or feature that is important or makes a place easily recognisable.</p>	
	<p>Is the weather the same everywhere in the UK?</p>	<p>The weather is sometimes the same everywhere in the UK but often different. It can be measured using a thermometer, rain gauge and weather vane.</p>	<p>Thermometer: An instrument for measuring temperature. Rain gauge: An instrument that measures the volume of rain in a given amount of time. Weather vane: An instrument that shows the direction of wind.</p>
