	What is the weather like in each season in Wiltshire?	<b>Mild</b> <b>Warm summers</b> <b>Cool and mild Autumn and Spring</b> <b>Cool to cold Winter</b>		<b>Season</b> -One of four parts of a year, marked by the weather conditions <b>Mild</b> - Weather that is not too hot, too cold, too humid or rainy.
	What types of farming happen in Wiltshire?	Growing crops, rearing animals such as sheep, cows for milk, cheese, yoghurt and beef. Egg farming.		<b>Crops</b> -fruit or vegetables grown on a farm <b>Farming</b> -A piece of land used to grow vegetables or raise animals for food.
