	Where is your local river?	The River Avon travels for 70 miles from it's source near Chipping Sodbury, Gloucestershire till it merges with the River Severn at it's estuary at Avonmouth.	<b>Estuary</b> -bodies of water found where rivers meet the sea. <b>Merge</b> -to blend or come together Valley-Long, low dip found between hills and mountains			
	How are rivers born?	A river starts at it's source as that is where rainwater usually falls. Usually high up in mountains or hills or where theres is a spring.	<b>Spring</b> -when pressure forces a natural flow of groundwater onto the earth's surface.			
	How does a river shape the land?	Rivers shape the land through erosion, transportation and deposition.	<b>Erosion</b> -Water, wind and other natural forces cause earth and rocks to wear away. <b>Transportation</b> -The movement of people and things from one place to another. <b>Deposition</b> -The laying down of sediment carried by wind, water or ice.			
	What employment did the River Severn provide to the local area?	Longest, naturally navigable river in England. The transport of goods by water before the building of the railways.	<b>Trade</b> -transfer of goods from one person to another often in exchange for money. <b>Locks</b> -A water tight chamber known as a lock basin used to raise or lower water level. <b>Navigation</b> -Finding the way from one place to another.
