Dear Parents and Carers,

I am delighted to introduce myself and to share how proud and excited I am to be joining Brinkworth Earl Danby's as Headteacher from January 2026. Having worked in education for over 20 years, I am looking forward to using my breadth of experience to bring stability to the school and to set ambitious outcomes for the children in our care.

My background spans teaching across the whole primary age phase, as well as holding senior leadership roles. Since my interview – a challenging and thorough two-day process – I have been visiting and communicating with the school regularly to ensure a clear understanding of the school and a smooth handover. During this time, I have been struck by the dedication of the entire school team, especially of Mrs Cross, whose commitment to pupils, staff, governors, and parents is clear to see. I would also like to take this opportunity to thank Mrs Jackson for her excellent work during Mrs Walch's absence and her support for the school community.

Brinkworth Earl Danby's is a wonderfully welcoming school with amazing children, and genuine ethos of care, it was this that inspired me to apply for the Headteacher role, a role I am proud to undertake.

I have quickly understood that the school is at a point where rapid progress is needed, and have worked with Mrs Jackson, Mrs Cross, the governing body and Wiltshire Council to evaluate and identify the essential next steps. I will be keen to share with you the key priorities of our action plan at our next Parent Forum meeting next term. 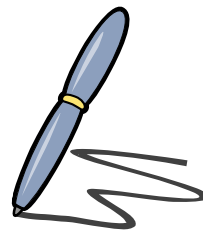

SENDCO UPDATE

Hello!

When considering the needs of our children, after considering what we can put in place using our universal offer, we look to the 'four broad areas of need' as stated in the SEND Code of Practice.

These categories can help us to identify and plan for a child's special educational needs, although a child may have needs that span one or more area.

- **Communication & Interaction:** This includes difficulties with language, communication, and social interaction, such as those experienced by children with autistic spectrum disorder (ASD).
- **Cognition & Learning:** This area covers a child's learning difficulties and covers a wide range of needs, from moderate to severe learning difficulties.
- **Social, Emotional & Mental Health difficulties:** This includes children who may be withdrawn or isolated, have attention deficit disorder (ADHD), or experience conditions like anxiety, depression, or self-harm.
- **Sensory and/or Physical needs:** This area includes children with vision impairment, hearing loss, or other physical disabilities that require specialist support or equipment.

Eligibility Criteria
Courses are no cost to learners who meet our eligibility criteria. Learners must be aged 19+ on 31 August this academic year; they must have a Wiltshire postcode and meet certain residency requirements. Learners must also be able to tick one of the following criteria: individual income less than £25,750 a year; in receipt of benefits (other than child benefit); be a care leaver, foster carer or carer; be a military family or ex-armed forces personnel; have refugee status; have a learning difficulty or disability; be looking to go into work, now or in the future.
