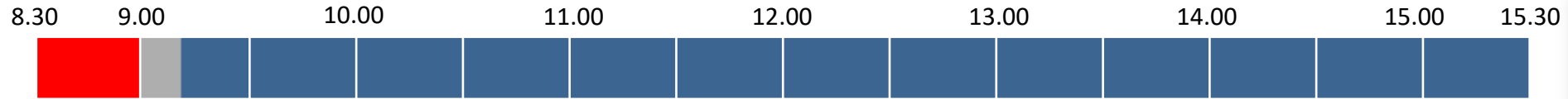

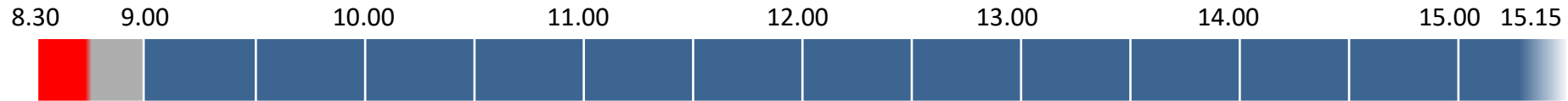
# Current Situation

## Upper Site



Gates Open 8.30  
Registration 9.00 – 9.10  
School finished 3.30

## Lower Site



Gates Open 8.30  
Registration 8.45 – 8.55  
School finished 3.15

## Reasons change is needed



Current school day exceeds the statutory 32.5-hour expectation (highlighted in red)



Staff have less time available for training, SEND development and curriculum improvement



Supporting staff wellbeing and retention is essential to maintaining high-quality education and stability for the children



Early morning unstructured time can lead to behaviour and first-aid incidents

# You Said, We Listened

**You said:** We wanted more information about the reasons for change.

**We listened:** We have provided more detail on the rationale, benefits and options considered.

**You said:** Families need enough time between sites.

**We listened:** We have continued to consider the importance of staggered timings in any proposed model.

**You said:** The impact on SEND pupils must be considered carefully.

**We listened:** SEND considerations remain a key part of the decision-making process.

**You said:** Traffic and safety may be affected.

**We listened:** Traffic, parking and transport implications have been reviewed as part of the consultation.

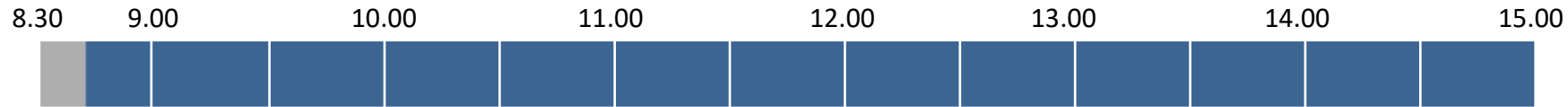
**You said:** Families are concerned about childcare and getting to work on time.

**We listened:** We have explored alternative options and continue to review the impact on families



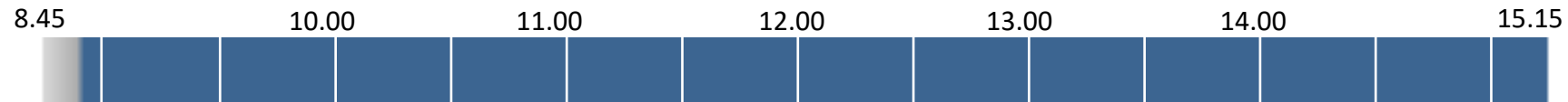
# Proposed Option

## Upper Site



Gates Open 8.30  
Registration closes 8.40  
School finished 3.00

## Lower Site



Gates Open 8.45  
Registration closes 8.55  
School finished 3.15

This is the preferred option identified by school leaders. Governors have not yet made a final decision and will consider all consultation feedback before doing so.
