Message from Mrs Butt

Parent Forum Summary and FAQs

Reading and Phonics

We discussed our continued use of the Little Wandle phonics programme and the support we are receiving from the English Hub at Ramsbury. This support helps ensure consistency in teaching, maintains high-quality phonics provision and ensures all pupils, including disadvantaged learners, can successfully access the programme.

Key points included:

Reading books in Key Stage 1 continue to be closely matched to the sounds children are learning in class.

Phonics assessments take place every six weeks.

Additional phonics support is available across both key stages.

Our focus remains on providing "keep-up" support rather than "catch-up" interventions.

Once children graduate from the phonics programme, they become free readers but we have aligned these books to reading age. Children are not limited in their book choices as we wish to engage a love of reading.

Reading records remain an important home-school communication tool.

We are moving away from extrinsic rewards for daily reading and instead aiming to develop children who are intrinsically motivated to read.

Children who demonstrate a love of reading through home reading, lessons, discussions and sharing reading experiences will be recognised through our Reading Café. We expect that all children read at least 3 times a week.

FAQs

How can I encourage my child to read if they are motivated by rewards?

Children who engage positively with reading and demonstrate enthusiasm for books will be recognised through our Reading Café celebrations.

Are there any phonics apps or websites that support learning at home?

There are phonics websites and apps available, although many do not align exactly with the Little Wandle progression because sounds may be taught in a different order. instead play "Shuffle Up" phonics card games

School Lunches

Meals not being hot enough.

Changes to the lunch service arrangement at the Upper Site.

Meals being served in containers rather than on plates.

The issue with meal temperature was linked to a fault with catering equipment, which has now been addressed.

The revised lunch arrangements ensure that children receiving school meals are served while meals are hot and safe to eat.

The use of containers supports compliance with food allergy procedures. Where allergy-specific meals are served, additional checks by staff are required to ensure children's safety. Containers also help ensure portion consistency and reduce food handling requirements.

At the Upper Site, the hall accommodates approximately 60 pupils at a time. Monitoring shows that children continue to have opportunities to eat comfortably and spend time with their friends across the hour long lunchtime.

Physical Education and Sports Provision

Some parents shared that children were disappointed following Steve's departure and that attitudes towards PE have been affected.

Explanation

Parents were reminded that changes were necessary due to reductions in PE and Sports Premium funding. National guidance is clear that this funding should primarily be used to improve the quality of teaching and develop staff expertise rather than fund long-term coaching roles.

Qualified teachers are responsible for delivering PE lessons as part of the curriculum not sports coaches.

Can parents help run sports clubs?

Yes. We would welcome parental involvement, provided safeguarding arrangements are in place and a member of the safeguarding team is present on site.

Homework

Parents expressed concerns about homework arrangements and preparing children for Year 7 in particular.

Discussion focused on research regarding the impact of homework showing little impact and the importance of balancing activities such as:

Spelling practice

NumBots

Times Table Rock Stars

Feedback on the previous "pick and mix" homework approach was negative at prior forums.

We are exploring options including:

Discounted CGP workbooks

Possible use of maths.co.uk, which has been used successfully and monitored previously with Y6

Swimming Costs

Questions were raised regarding the increase in swimming costs from £35 to £65.

The increase reflects rising costs and reduced Sports Premium funding which previously subsidised.

We would like to reassure parents that contributions are not being used to subsidise other families, as this would not be permitted. We also discussed that many schools offer swimming during only one year of Key Stage 2, whereas our current provision allows children to access swimming annually.

If affordability becomes a significant concern for families, the wider swimming offer may need to be reviewed in future.

Class Dojo and the School Website

Some expressed concerns about increased screen time, while others asked whether information could be streamlined so that families receive content most relevant to their child's class.

Questions were also raised at Meet the Teacher sessions about the future role of the school website.

We reassured parents that the website is currently being updated and reorganised to make it more user-friendly for both current and prospective families.

Several parents also shared that they particularly value seeing key dates, class information and events within the newsletter. This feedback has been shared with the administration team as part of our ongoing review of communications and Class Dojo usage.
